JOHN HOOTON MFIAP FIPF FRPS

Irish landscape photographer John Hooton has been photographing the landscape for the past 30 years. He is captivated by the varying light and mood of Ireland's Atlantic coastline. Exploring this region has offered him an insight into the way our landscape has transformed and evolved over centuries. John's images reflect the changing light, and his use of a wide-angle lens lends to it a better sense of place and location. He does not depend totally on photoshop and endeavours to do most of his work 'on site'.

Originally using mainly slide film, in 2009 he finally made the transition to digital. Shortly after he was invited to join Permajet's team of print lecturers, and gained his MFIAP. John is a founder member of Mallow Camera Club and has held many positions within the club. A past committee member of the Irish Photographic Federation Council (IPF), he is currently one of their adjudicators on their national Distinction Panel and has been a judge for numerous prestigious competitions.

John's work has appeared extensively in salons throughout the world having gained numerous acceptances and awards. He has also done a number of personal exhibitions both in Ireland and abroad. From his base on the Dingle Peninsula John presently runs weekend photographic courses. www.john-hooton.com

Edmund Fellowes, one of this year's Nature judges, is a lifelong bird watcher and naturalist, having put up his first bird photography hide when still a schoolboy. He is very involved with the British Trust for Ornithology, but is interested in all branches of nature. He pursues his hobby mainly in Dumfriesshire but has also been able to travel to all seven continents.

Edmund has been a member of Dumfries Camera Club for 44 years, and is a past member of the Scottish Photographic Federation committee. He is a prolific Lecturer on his subject, not just to photographic clubs but also to ornithological and zoological societies.

Over the years Edmund has been very successful with his nature images. He has won the "British Birds" bird photograph of the year on a remarkable four occasions.

Having some years ago obtained his MPAGB with slides of birds; in 2014 he gained his FRPS, with a panel of prints about bird behaviour. "I enjoy the preparatory fieldwork involved in bird photography, as much as the photographic element" said Edmund.

Barry's involvement with photography has been extensive since the mid-1970s. He has had numerous one-man exhibitions including The Royal Photographic Society in 1990 and the Dublin Photographic Centre in 1991. As a PAGB judge Barry has selected for many international salons, as well as for the PAGB Awards. In 1991 he was awarded the RPS Fenton Medal and Honorary Life Membership of the RPS.

His work ranges from wildlife, landscape to very creative computer constructed images. His regular success in international salons is with the three main types of work he produces; the majority of the awards gained are for wildlife work and creative images. Most of his wildlife work is Africa, Falklands and Florida, some in the UK. His creative works have a strong sci-fi/fantasy influence. He is a regular on the club lecture circuit. In 2014 he was awarded an APAGB for services to photography. Barry

is involved with photography full-time, and is represented by a major image library as well as his own website www.barrymead-photography.com He is another of this year's Nature Judges.

Hunter's interest in photography spans nearly 40 years. He joined Carluke Camera Club in 1977, some three months after its inception. He has served on the committee in almost every senior post including six years as president. Hunter's primary interest has always been in printing, he was well known for spending all day in the darkroom. Monochrome was his preferred medium, before colour Cibachrome came along. Hunter considered himself a keen club photographer until, in 1999 he started entering international salons. Photography is now a full time hobby.


Currently he is the Senior Vice President of the Scottish Photographic Federation, and barring mishaps will become president in 2016. Although best known for his landscape photography, he is also a keen observer of people and gets great pleasure in candid photography.

Roger became involved in photography while still at school in 1958 when a family friend suggested that he should go along to the nearby Smethwick Photographic Society to further his interest. He has been a member ever since, serving as President on three separate occasions and has been their Secretary for over 50 years.

He is Chairman of the Smethwick International Exhibition and is a very keen exhibitor, both in National and International Exhibitions, gaining many awards. He has been a jury member of numerous National and International Exhibitions both here in the UK and also in Europe.

Twice President of the Midland Counties Photographic Federation he is now the MCPF Member of the PAGB Executive where he Chairs the Judges Selection Committee and is a member of the FIAP Sub Committee.

SIX SEPARATE SECTIONS – THREE PROJECTED DIGITAL IMAGE AND THREE PRINT Monochrome Open, Colour Open and Nature Sections

Approximately 25% of each Section will be accepted.

A maximum of 4 photographs may be submitted per section, per author.

Each entrant will receive a printed colour catalogue (FIAP 4* in 2014)

Entries containing PROJECTED DIGITAL IMAGES <u>must</u> be entered via our website ONLINE ENTRY ONLY;

PDI - Maximum Image size 1400 pixels horizontal and 1050 pixels vertical in jpeg format.

Colour space sRGB or AdobeRGB1998. Our projection background is black.

Image Filename – You do not need to number or enter a particular filename before uploading – The Title you enter in the box supplied will be the title for that image

Please ensure that you enter your TITLE how you wish it to appear in the Catalogue.

PRINTS must not exceed 500x400 mm, no minimum size. UNMOUNTED is preferred.

Overseas prints MUST be un-mounted, but UK mounted prints will be accepted.

NATURE SECTIONS - Images to be considered for the Wildlife Medal must be marked "W" by the entrant as certification that the photograph complies with both the NEW general nature and authentic wildlife definitions (See Definitions section of website under Rules)

All payment options are catered for via our NEW Online Entry system
UK Entrants – Can pay by CASH, CHEQUE or PAYPAL payment via our Website
Overseas Entrants – Can pay by CASH or PAYPAL payment via our Website - Paypal is preferred


Judith is a keen exhibitor both in the UK and abroad where she has been successful, gaining many awards. She has also served as a jury member both in the UK and abroad.

GROUP/CLUB ENTRIES

We Welcome Group or Club entries to take advantage of the reduced fees, or postage 3 or 4 Individuals, or a Club can enter together, using our Group Online Entry, and enter for a discounted rate. The full Group or Club entry forms and digital upload must be completed online - together - by one designated member of the Group or Club. Group/Club entries can be made up of a mixture of Prints and PDIs entries.

Prints can be posted in 1 or 2 packages if the weight requires this but please ensure that a paper copy of all your Online Entry Forms are included together with any payment. You do not have to be a bone fide Club to enter as a Group, but only Clubs or Societies are eligible for the Best Club Awards.

Full 'HELP' notes are available for making GROUP entries using our Online Entry system from the website Home page – HELP notes show the entire Online Entry process as screen dumps



Please note that for Group/Club Entries, all results, all catalogues and all prints will be returned to the one address, that of the designated Group/Club Organiser. Prints can still be forwarded to Edinburgh International or the Northern Counties.

Club Entries are accepted at £1 (2 Euros/US \$2) per photograph – minimum remittance £20 (40 Euros/US \$40) PLUS RETURN POSTAGE (See website for postage rate. £ Sterling Cheques only accepted on UK banks - see Entry Fees section for full details)

Overseas Entrants – Maximum weight of packages to be returned not to exceed 2 kilos (If you wish packages bigger than this returned, assuming no postage restrictions apply, extra postage will be required). Entries should be sent with customs labels stating - 'Photographs for exhibition only' 'To be returned to sender' 'NO COMMERCIAL VALUE'

There are awards for The Best Club from out with the UK, from within the UK (out with Scotland) and for the Best Scottish Club. A League Table of Clubs will be published – Clubs will be awarded 1 point for each Print. / PDI entered and 10 points for each

published – Clubs will be awarded 1 point for each Print / PDI entered, and 10 points for each Print / PDI acceptance, and a further 2 points for an Individual award. The Clubs with the highest points totals will be awarded SPF Gold Medals for the Best Club entries and the 'Dumfries Octocentenary Trophy' will be presented to the Best Scottish Club entry.

The only exception to this rule is that prints entered into the Nature Section of the Scottish Salon may be entered in to either of the two sections at Edinburgh.



COMPLETING ONLINE ENTRIES

Online Entry 'HELP' notes are available from our Home Page HELP notes show the entire Online Entry process as screen dumps

When you go to validate your email address when signing up; If our email and validation link doesn't appear very quickly, please check your Spam/Junk folder. If it's in your Spam/Junk folder you will need to move it to your Inbox for the link to work. You should also mark us as "trusted", to ensure you receive your results email or add web@scottish-photographic-salon.org to your address book. Don't hesitate to contact us if you have a problem.

Make sure YOU correct any errors before pressing the SUBMIT button. You can amend your entry and SAVE as often as you like up to this point. For any corrections after you have pressed SUBMIT please contact us. You can print out a copy of your completed Entry Form at any time. Please remember that we require a paper copy to be enclosed with your prints, or with your cheque or cash payment, if you are not paying by Paypal.
